prose and poetry of a particular immigrant experience and also of such universal themes as the pains confusions and wonders of growing up

a new survey of twentieth century u s poetry that places a special emphasis on poets who have put lyric poetry in dialogue with other forms of creative expression including modern art the novel jazz memoir and letters contesting readings of twentieth century american poetry as hermetic and narcissistic morris interprets the lyric as a scene of instruction and thus as a public oriented genre american poets from robert frost to sherman alexie bring aesthetics to bear on an exchange that asks readers to think carefully about the ethical demands of reading texts as a reflection of how we metaphorically read the world around us and the persons places and things in it his survey focuses on poems that foreground scenes of conversation teaching and debate involving a strong willed lyric speaker and another self bent on resisting how the speaker imagines the world

broken souths offers the first in depth study of the diverse field of contemporary latina o poetry its innovative angle of approach puts latina o and latin american poets into sustained conversation in original and rewarding ways in addition author michael dowdy presents ecocritical readings that foreground the environmental dimensions of current latina o poetics dowdy argues that a transnational latina o imaginary has emerged in response to neoliberalism the free market philosophy that underpins what many in the northern hemisphere refer to as globalization his work examines how poets represent the places that have been broken by globalization s political economic and environmental upheavals broken souths locates the roots of the new imaginary in 1968 when the mexican student movement crested and the chicano and nuyorican movements emerged in the united states it theorizes that lating o poetics negotiates tensions between the late 1960s oppositional collective identities and the present day s radical individualisms and discourses of assimilation including the post colonial post national and post revolutionary dowdy is particularly interested in how latina o poetics reframes debates in cultural studies and critical geography on the relation between place space and nature broken souths features discussions of latina o writers such as victor hernández cruz martín espada juan felipe herrera guillermo verdecchia marcos mcpeek villatoro maurice kilwein guevara judith ortiz cofer jack agüeros marjorie agosín

valerie martínez and ariel dorfman alongside discussions of influential latin american writers including roberto bolaño ernesto cardenal david huerta josé emilio pacheco and raúl zurita

in this new study ylce irizarry moves beyond literature that prioritizes assimilation to examine how contemporary fiction depicts being cuban dominican mexican or puerto rican within chicana o and latina o america irizarry establishes four dominant categories of narrative loss reclamation fracture and new memory that address immigration gender and sexuality cultural nationalisms and neocolonialism as she shows narrative concerns have moved away from the weathered notions of arrival and assimilation contemporary chicana o and latina o literatures instead tell stories that have little if anything to do with integration into the anglo american world the result is the creation of new memory this reformulation of cultural membership unmasks the neocolonial story and charts the conscious engagement of cultural memory it outlines the ways contemporary chicana o and latina o communities create belonging and memory of their ethnic origins an engaging contribution to an important literary tradition chicana o and latina o fiction privileges the stories chicanas os and latinas os remember about themselves rather than the stories of those subjugating them naccs book award national association for chicana and chicano studies 2018 mla prize in united states latina and latino and chicana and chicano literary and cultural studies modern language association 2017

there is a wealth of published literature in english by latin american women writers but such material can be difficult to locate due to the lack of available bibliographic resources in addition the various types of published narrative short stories novels novellas autobiographies and biographies by latin american women writers has increased significantly in the last ten to fifteen years to address the lack of bibliographic resources kathy leonard has compiled latin american women writers a resource guide to titles in english this reference includes all forms of narrative short story autobiography novel novel excerpt and others by latin american women dating from 1898 to 2007 more than 3 000 individual titles are included by more than 500 authors this includes nearly 200 anthologies more than 100 autobiographies biographies or other narrative and almost 250 novels written by more than 100 authors from 16 different countries for the

purposes of this bibliography authors who were born in latin america and either continue to live there or have immigrated to the united states are included also titles of pieces are listed as originally written in either spanish or portuguese if the book was originally written in english a phrase to that effect is included to better reflect the linguistic diversity of narrative currently being published this volume contains seven indexes authors by country of origin authors titles of work titles of work authors autobiographies biographies and other narrative anthologies novels and novellas in alphabetical order by author and novels and novellas by authors country of origin reflecting the increase in literary production and the facilitation of materials this volume contains a comprehensive listing of narrative pieces in english by latin american women writers not found in any other single volume currently on the market this work of reference will be of special interest to scholars students and instructors interested in narrativ

this textbook takes a new approach to teaching creative writing that centers the concerns of multicultural students it focuses on the experiences of those who wish to write through their diverse identities including ethnic cultural racial national regional and international identity as well as gender identity sexual preference class position and disability combining the study of culturally diverse literature with the process of writing students are encouraged to engage with various texts and to use them to inspire their own work organized around a series of writing prompts and discussions of literary readings that address identity place perception family community encounters inheritance and resistance this book offers both writers and teachers a way to engage with the practice of writing from a multicultural perspective

teaching literature in the world language classroom presents a five stage methodology for teaching literature in language curriculum that repurposes bloom s original and revised taxonomy to promote the language acquisition process and spark other types

of learning the first step of text selection preparation and initiation asks students to recognize familiar words structures and concepts contextualize the reading and remember the main details of the text the second stage of beginning literary analysis gets target language learners to describe identify and understand the basic elements of plot character setting and narration the third phase of intermediate literary analysis prompts students to interpret analyze and examine major themes key passages and the overall commentary the fourth step of advanced literary analysis teaches students to synthesize multiple and conflicting interpretations compare assigned texts across units or themes and evaluate works through essay writing the fifth stage of reflective and creative engagement challenges students to relate the assigned texts to themselves through personal and intercultural reflection create new artistic works and produce unique texts in the target language the concluding chapter showcases all five stages of the methodology by applying them to a sample text thereby inviting world language educators to assess the potential usefulness of comfort and scharf's approach to their own language courses this is an ideal resource for world language educators teaching literature as well as undergraduate and graduate education students focusing on target language literature instruction and its role in the language acquisition process
